Prelude

Meaning of This Service

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. It takes its name from the ceremonial imposition of ashes on the foreheads of worshipers as a sign of human sin and mortality. This ancient tradition, going back at least to the tenth century, communicates the human condition before God by solemn word and sign.

The Sign of Ashes

Leader: Accomplish in us the work of Your salvation,

People: That we may show forth Your glory.

Leader: By the cross and passion of our Savior,

People: Bring us with all Your saints to the joy of Christ's resurrection.
